

What is the Program?

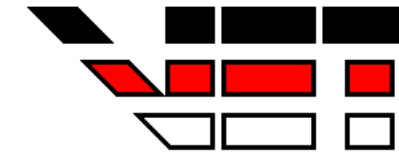
The Vocational Enhanced Transition [VET] Program, held in the MARC, Inc. Life Skills Center, is an intensive 16-week program that blends classroom time with targeted, individually tailored internships. By partnering with our local small businesses and community organizations, we provide our interns with disabilities the opportunity to learn transferrable, hands-on job skills while simultaneously developing their personal resumes and securing employment references.

Benefits for Participants & Businesses:

- Provides transferrable job skills and resume references to use in gaining competitive independent employment.
- Provides education on the State and Federal benefits for businesses that hire individuals with disabilities.
- Develops key skills not only for gaining and maintaining independent employment, but for living a healthy and fulfilling lifestyle.
- Provides opportunities to meet base-level staffing needs for businesses at no cost to their bottom line, and no liability; VET Interns and MARC, Inc. Skills Trainers are covered by MARC's umbrella insurance & compensation policies.
- Internships are individually-tailored to focus upon developing an intern's strength areas.
- Provides opportunities to train potential new hires to meet your needs and "try-out" a new employee without risk of commitment.
- Work towards independence in areas such as transportation, self-advocacy, health and wellness, financial literacy, etc.

Who Is Eligible To Participate?

- Individuals currently enrolled in a GSE or DSO with Work Program who are receiving DDS funding for employment services.
- Each 16-week program cycle has an extremely limited number of participant slots, to ensure maximum exposure and training time for each individual participant.
